1 – Introduction

1.1 Description

The Rallye Auto International Baie-des-Chaleurs 2022 is a car competition that will take place in New Richmond, Quebec, Canada on July 1st to 3rd, 2022.

The following abbreviations will be used in this document to present the different championships:

•	NRC	FIA NACAM Rally Championship
•	CRC	Canadian Rally Championship
•	NARC	North American Rally Cup
•	ECRC	Eastern Canada Rally Championship
•	RSQ	Championnat de Rallye du Québec
•	CRAB	Club Event, Club Rallye Auto de la Baje des Chaleurs

The event will count towards the following championships (drivers, co-drivers and manufacturers):

- Round 3 of FIA NACAM Rally Championship (NRC)
- Round 3 of Canadian Rally Championship (CRC)
- Round 8 of North American Rally Cup (NARC)
- Round 2 of Eastern Canada Rally Championship (ECRC)
- Round 3 of Championnat de Rallye du Québec (RSQ)

The CRC, ECRC and RSQ Championships are sanctioned by the CARS General Competition Rules and National Rally Rules at: https://carsrally.ca/cars-home/. The ECRC and RSQ Championships will also comply with their respective championship regulations available at: http://www.ecrc-crec.ca/index.php/en_ca/ and http://www.rsq.qc.ca/

**For teams wishing to participate in the CRAB club regional event portion (Legs C and D on Sunday), you must be a 2022 member of the Club de Rallye Auto de la Baie des Chaleurs. You can get your membership card at: https://rallyebdc.com/membership/.

Modifications, amendments and / or changes to the specific regulations or to the timetable will be announced by numbered bulletins, dated and approved by the clerk of the course and by a steward. These bulletins will be posted on the official virtual board during the event on the website: https://rallyebdc.com/ and will be emailed to the competitors. Notifications can also be given at a time control where competitors will be invited to read them and signify that they have received the notification.

1.2 Surface of competition roads and distance

The stages will be on gravel and dirt roads. The maximum altitude above the mean sea level is 300 meters.

The NRC, CRC and NARC portions will consist of 18 special stages split into 4 legs. The approximate total distance is 450 km including 205 km in timed stages. The regional CREC and RSQ portions are the leg A and B for an approximate distance of 300 km including 120 km in timed stages. The complete schedule and distances will be emailed to the teams in the weeks preceding the event. The CRAB club event portions are the leg C and D for an approximate distance of 150 km including 80 km in timed stages.



5 – Registration

5.1 Registration date

Registrations will be accepted until the registration period closes on Friday July 1st, 2022 at 7h00.

We will accept a maximum of 50 cars. If there are more than 50 registrations, a waiting list will be made in order of receipt of registrations and payment. A registration must be fully paid to be considered accepted.

The early bird registration period will be from May 2nd, 2022 8h00 to June 10, 2022 at 19h00.

The regular registration period will be from June 10th, 2022 at 19h00 to July 1st, 2022 at 7h00.

5.2 Registration procedure

The registration form is available at: www.rallyebdc.com

For a registration to be accepted and for the crew to be displayed on the provisional start list, the registration form must be completely filled out and the fees must be paid in full by credit card (PayPal), Interac e-transfer or check.

5.4 Payment procedure

5.5 Refund

A complete registration can be withdrawn:

- Without penalty, up to 48 hours before the start of registration at headquarters, June 28th, 2022 at 17h00
- With a penalty of 25% of the registration fee, less than 48 hours before the start of registration
- No refund after June 30, 2022 at 17h00.

5.6 Documents to verify (E-mail)

The information in the team registration form will be verified and the following documents will be reviewed electronically by our registrar. The documents are to accompany the entry form via email at info@rallyebdc.com

- Authorization from the respective ASN for competitors with an international licence
- CARS self-declarations will be required for both event registration and technical inspection
- Drivers and co-drivers must also sign the CARS Entry Form Waiver and in addition all
 competitors and service team members must sign the CARS General and Insurer Waivers as well
 as the CARS Covid 19 Waiver.

5.7 Event registration and delivery of rally documents

Registration for the crew at the event will take place on June 30th, 2022 between 18h00 and 19h30. Competitors must report to the place indicated in section 3.1

5.8 Documents provided

During registration and administrative verification, the following documents will be provided:

- Route book and reconnaissance book;
- A wristband for each crew member registered for the event (which will be used to enable entry to the service park);
- Instruction for checking the odometer;
- Door panels, windshield stickers (sold by CARS if necessary);
- Competition number decals;
- Sponsor decals with instructions;
- Service book with routes, map, itineraries and distance between each service;
- Two "Service" decals will be given to each crew to put on 2 vehicles of your choice to access the service area (excluding trailers and rally cars).

6 – Insurance

6.1 Liability insurance

Event participants are covered by third party liability, bodily injury and property damage insurance up to \$5,000,000 CDN

6.2 Health Insurance

Teams (driver, co-driver and service team) from outside of Quebec must ensure that they have personal health insurance coverage providing basic medical care coverage.

6.3 Coverage period

Event insurance coverage covers teams during special stages only. Civil liability and damage outside the stages are the responsibility of each competitor's automobile insurance policy. Insurance coverage for the event ends at the end of the rally or if the team withdraws.

7 – Advertising and car identification

7.1 Obligations and restrictions

Cars must display the numbers, windshield and door decals as specified in Appendix 3 and be in place during the technical inspection.

7.2 Additional advertising

It's mandatory for all competitors to clearly and optimally display all decals provided by CARS and event sponsors. They should be affixed in places identified by the organization.

7.3 Competition numbers

The numbers decals provided by the organization must be affixed on the front doors, on the upper part of the front windshield as well as on the rear side windows.

The numbers must be kept on the car for the duration of the competition and must be clean and visible at the start of each rally stage.

8 – Reconnaissance (recce)

8.1 Date

The reconnaissance of the roads is optional for the competitors, but it is strongly recommended. Recce will operate in accordance with CARS regulations.

The recce will take place on July 1st, 2022 between 6h30 and 16h00. A team observed on stages outside this period will be reported to the stewards for sanction.

8.2 Inscription

All competitors wishing to participate in the recee must register at the headquarters by respecting the time indicated in section 4.1. They will then receive the following documents and objects:

- Route book
- Recce schedule

The number decals is to be affixed to the upper right side (co-driver) of the windshield and must be visible throughout the recce.

8.3 Specific Directives

The instructions for the conduct of the recce will be sent by email to the competitors. During the reconnaissance, the competitors will not be able to use their rally car. The teams will be authorized to run a maximum of 2 times each stage during the reconnaissance. Teams are prohibited from driving in the direction opposite to that of the event, except on exceptions issued by the organization. If an event is run more than once during the rally, it will be in 2 runs only during reconnaissance. For security reasons, it is important to follow the schedule established by the organization.

The competitors must take into consideration that during the reconnaissance, the rally roads will be open to road users and especially to logging trucks. It is imperative to respect the safety and rights of all users.

8.4 Observation control

The organization reserves the right to hold observational checks during reconnaissance to verify compliance with the rules that apply.

The maximum speed is 60 km/h on rally roads during reconnaissance or the authorized speed when indicated by a sign. The maximum speed during transport is that indicated on the road signs. If there are infractions, the penalties will be calculated according to RNR 13.6.12.

9 – Technical inspection

9.1 Items required to access

- Vehicle logbook
- Technical Inspection Self-Declaration
- All the required vehicle identification elements (ex: numbers, advertising, etc.) must be affixed as indicated in Appendix 3
- All safety equipment (racing suits, helmets, head and neck protection devices (Hans))
- Competitors must demonstrate the correct operation of the auxiliary headlights according to article 12.4.2.2 of NRR;
- The competition vehicle and its safety elements must comply with the rules of sections 11 and 12 of the CARS GCR and NRR available at: https://carsrally.ca/wp-content/uploads/2015/09/CARS 2022 En Rule Book -Final.pdf

9.2 Schedule and location

See section 4.2 for the schedule.

9.3 Fuelling

All competitor vehicles competitors must be presented at the technical inspection with a full tank of fuel for the first part of the rally.

9.4 Logbook

During the inspection, your logbook will be retained by the Inspection Manager. The books will be presented at the awards' ceremony. If a team does not finish the rally, due to mechanical breakdown or otherwise, the vehicle will be inspected before handing over the logbook. Unclaimed logbooks will be given to the National Series Manager for mailing later.

9.5 RallySafe Unit

Upon inspection, all rally cars will need to be fitted with the permanent installation kit to receive the RallySafe unit advertised in CARS Bulletin 2022-01 available at: https://carsrally.ca/cars-bulletins/bulletin-2022-01rallysafe-for-the-canadian-rally-championship/

The RallySafe unit will be handed out during registration for the event and must be installed and in operation before you present yourself for technical inspection.

Each team will receive a "RallySafe" tracking unit upon registration and must be returned to us when the crew withdraws from the event or to the Parc Fermé at the end of the rally.

<u>10 – Other procedures</u>

10.1 Units of measure

All distances are in kilometers. A measured trip allowing the odometer to be adjusted will be included with the route book.

10.2 Official time

The official time for the Rallye Auto International Baie-des-Chaleurs will be the one posted at headquarters.

10.3 Control procedure

See section 15.4 of the CARS GCR and NRR

10.4 Timing procedure

Section 15.5 of the CARS GCR and NRR

The timing system used will be that of RallySafe. Using this system will allow the compilation team to view the results in near real time.

Manual timing will be used as a back-up system.

10.5 Start procedure

A competitor should start every minute. The first 5 drivers (or the equivalent number of drivers with a speed factor greater than 85) will have an additional minute.

The organizers can allocate an extra minute to a driver who does not have a CARS speed factor (example an international driver). The organizers may possibly ask these drivers to provide the results of one or more previous rallies.

10.6 Special stage start procedures

The start countdown will be done directly on the RallySafe unit in the car.

10.7 Parc Fermé and End procedures

- 1. Following the technical inspection, all competition vehicles will be placed in the pre-rally parc ferme. The pre-rally parc ferme will open 15 minutes before the start time of stage A allocated to each team according to the official starting order.
- 2. After entering the last major time control, a Parc Fermé will be set up at the end of the rally. Cars will be placed until its opening announced by a steward. Each team must designate a member who must stay with the vehicle in the event that a technical inspection is requested. All cars must remain in the Parc Fermé until the end of it, which will be announced by a marshal.
- 3. The Parc Fermé NRC, CRC and NARC Championship will be held at the end of the rally.
- 4. A Parc Fermé will be set up in the service area at the end of LEG B for competitors participating only in the regional part of the rally. All cars must remain in the Parc Fermé until the end of it, which will be announced by a marshal.

10.8 Parc Exposé

After the Major Time Control (CHM), between each LEG, any competition vehicle that will still be in the race MUST remain in this service area. In fact, the Service Area becomes an Parc Exposé and the service will be authorized. If ever a crew removes their competition vehicle from the Parc Exposé, a fine of \$ 300 will be imposed. The time for refueling will be at the beginning of the transport of LEG "B, C & D".

10.9 Re-start procedure after abandonment

A team that has abandoned the rally may request a re-start by following the procedure described in the CARS NRR in section 15.15.

10.10 Plastic tarpaulin

All crews must have a plastic tarpaulin under the race car during services.

10.11 Refueling

All competition vehicles must come to the technical inspection with a full tank of gasoline for the first part of the rally.

The refueling of cars will only be done in the specific refueling zone. This area will be annexed to the service area but will not be considered a service area. No refueling will be allowed in the service area, all refueling must take place in the refueling zone.

The service book will provide guidance for planning fuel management. The distance between each refueling will not exceed 120 km.

The time for refueling will be included in the transport times.

10.12 Special security procedure

A safety procedure is put in place at the end of the Saut du 5 in the case of an accident following the jump of a competitor in front. 350 meters before the end of the special, a triangle will be deployed by a volunteer in the case of a problem following the jump, if the triangle is deployed in front of you, you will have to slow down to 20 km/h in order to be able to immobilize yourself in the case of complete blockage after the end jump. Failure to comply with these regulations will be sanctioned by the stewards.

11 – Festives activities pre-rally

11.1 Special reunion evening

The Club de Rallye Auto de la Baie-des-Chaleurs is very pleased to invite you to a special 5 to 7 evening to highlight its 50th anniversary and the great accomplishment of certain club members in 2021. This evening will take place on Thursday, June 30th, 2022 following the registration of the teams at the address mentioned in section 3.1.

Admission will be free for drivers and co-drivers. However, any additional person will have to pay \$10 which will give access to the evening. Come and discover local flavours.

11.2 Shakedown

A road of around 3 km will be made available to crews wishing to test their car. There will be no limit to the number of passes each team may make, provided they are made within the allotted time.

The shakedown will take place on Friday July 2nd between 17h30 and 19h00.

The location will be disclosed to you upon registration and the route will be included in the reconnaissance.

11.3 Family Day Downtown

For the pleasure of all rally fans, the Town of New Richmond will hold a Family Day (downtown) on July 1st, 2022 and wishes to make it a festive day.

We therefore invite each team to participate in this day by leaving their rally car on display (downtown) between 12h00 and 16h00 for the pleasure of young and old. The road in front of the town hall will be closed for the occasion to make way for the party.

The Town of New Richmond and our organizing committee thank you in advance for your cooperation.

11.4 Ceremonial start

A Ceremonial Start with presentation of the teams will be held on July 1st, 2022 in the evening.

Teams (Driver and co-driver) must be present in front of the New Richmond Town Hall at the address indicated in section 3.5 from 19h30 and on to show their car (red carpet). Competitors must also wear their racing suit.

An official photo of the competitors will be taken on the steps of the town hall at 19h45 on July 1st.

Thereafter at 20h00 there will be the official presentation of the teams with their cars on podium. The presentation of the teams will be done in reverse order of numbers.

12 - Podiums and trophies

12.1 Podiums

The presentation of the podiums will take place at the end of the rally. Podium will be set up to present positions 1, 2, and 3 of each category eligible for a podium.

12.2 Trophies

A special "Richard Robertson" prize will be awarded to the crew who demonstrated the best sportsmanship during the rally. A prize will also be awarded to the team best prepared for registration and to the team best prepared for inspection.

List of trophies and podiums

The emblematic trophy awarded by the Rallye Auto International Baie-des-Chaleurs will be awarded to the first position in the general classification of the rally. Trophies will be awarded for the following podiums:

• CRC 3 first place overall

• CRC 3 first place 2 wheels drive

• RSQ 3 first place overall

• RSQ 3 first place 2 wheels drive

• CRAB 3 first place overall

• NACAM According to the applicable rules of the Championship



Round 3 of the FIA NACAM International Rally Championship (NRC)

The NACAM Championship will be run in accordance with the FIA International Sporting Code and Regional Sporting Regulations for Rally F | IA (FIA-RRSR) and the NACAM rally championship.

Exception to FIA Regional Rally regulation, The timing process used will be that of the Canadian Rally Championship in accordance with section 15 of the NRR: https://carsrally.ca/wp-content/uploads/2015/09/CARS 2022 En Rule Book -Final.pdf

A 45 minutes service will be allowed at the end of LEG B.

A Parc Fermé will be set up in the service area at the end of LEG B. All cars must remain in the Parc Fermé until the end of it, which will be announced by a marshal.

A 30 minutes service will be allowed before the start of LEG C.

The NRC Rally will consist of 18 special stages and transport in 4 stages. The approximate total distance will be 450 km, including 200 km in special stages.
